Information

On 29 March 2019 the UK is expected to leave the European Union (EU), irrespective of whether there is a Withdrawal Agreement with transition period or a 'no deal' scenario. In a 'no deal' scenario, from 30 March 2019 the UK will be regarded as a third country by the EU, therefore all EU legislation will cease to apply.

The current political situation in the UK is generating a lot of uncertainty and there is no clear view of which outcome is more or less likely to happen. The probability of a 'no deal' scenario has decreased, although it is still the only default outcome if no other option is put into place. In this context, CTPA is organising an EU Exit ('Brexit') seminar 'CTPA Navigating the New Cosmetics Landscape' to provide delegates with the latest developments on the UK and EU political landscapes, an overview of the UK Government policy agenda and regulatory landscape and contingency planning case studies.

The afternoon will start with a short introduction of where we are now, showing the roadmap of CTPA activities in the last year in relation to Brexit. The session will then quickly move on to both the UK and EU political landscapes, focussing on understanding the latest political situation and its implications.

The event will continue with a more practical session, aiming to give companies a comprehensive overview of the 'no deal' policy agenda of the UK Government Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) – our Competent Authority. Customs and logistics issues will be highlighted, and delegates will be given a workable outline of the key actions that should be taken in order to prepare their business for a 'no deal' scenario. CTPA will conclude with how it is helping members through the complexity of Brexit.

The seminar will close with a discussion panel that will target key industry concerns and will provide answers to delegates' questions.

Delegates are reminded that, due to the uncertainty of the topic, the programme is subject to change at short notice.

Jubilee, Piccadilly & Victoria lines

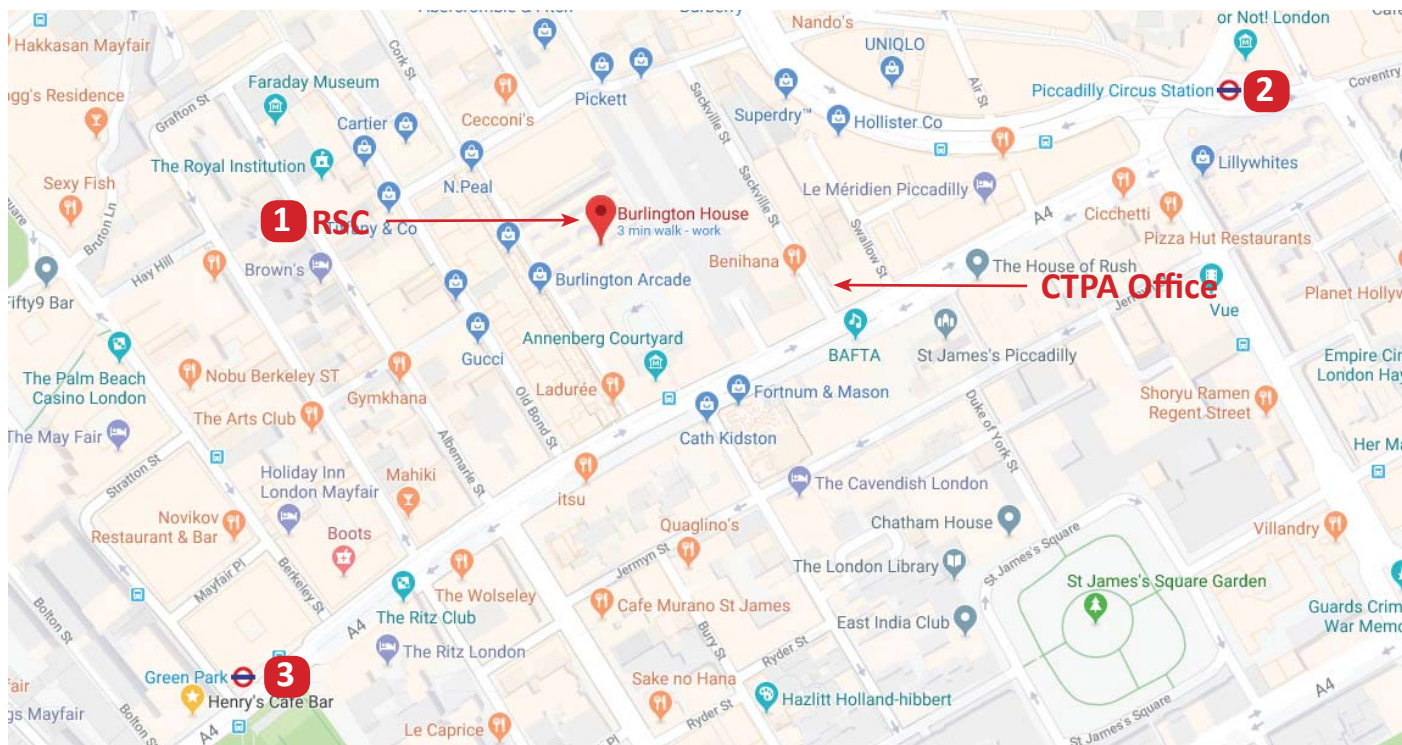
By Bus
